- 1. Call to order & Welcome- Geri
- 2. NE/IA Trustee Report —Joe Melcher -Region 5 Trustee report- He is in the 2nd year of his term in one year he will need a replacement; candidate must have been a LT Governor See Joe, if interested. Division 11 leads the entire district in membership.; A new division, #25 has been created. It used to be #24 West. The trustees are working on updating their I-Plan and also to improve the CLE training program. Everyone is looking for **"Sponsors" to improve funding for districts, special events and even clubs.** Consider selling advertisements for programs or websites (See the Jefferson website as an example)

VCPO is now for young children -pre-birth to 8; Also looking at the Hunger theme for youth – Johnston has started Little Food Pantries; Starting a Membership blitz - because of declining membership in all clubs. Plan early for your Governor's visit to get on schedule – very busy. Group looking at the K-Leader program to determine if it needs to be "tweaked" and how.... Now looking for a replacement for Larry Ziska – Will be Either Secretary OR Treasurer. Our current District Secretary, Amber LOVES event planning, but does not like administration so much ② (Job is currently about 42% Admin, 45% event planning and 13% Finance). Because this position serves at the pleasure of the District Governor. Consideration is being given to continuing her services (part time?) and hiring someone else (part time?) for the admin work The incoming district Governor has 11 of the new Lt Governors lined up for the coming year.

- 3. NE/IA Foundation Report Gerri Bugg Have a meeting this Friday afternoon. District may start sending invoices for the foundation dues (\$6 each), because some clubs fail to know where to send them.....They also appreciate individual contributions; about 12-15 members (of 5000) donate to the district and about (??) of 200,000 donate to the Children's fund; Jody is the vice chair of the Foundation and reported that the Girl Scouts of Johnston had put a Little Food Pantry by the library it is relatively new, so no reports on performance are available. The Foundation wants to start this project in our District.
- Teen Maze 2019 Gerri Bugg Planning and preparation is coming along well. Online sign up for volunteers is often being handled by one person per club. Meeting this Thursday evening at 5:30 pm. Will have a new booth on "Self Care" Mental and Physical; "First Impressions" Speed Interviewing
 - Miracle Field Update —Jody Melcher \$75,000 pledged & almost completed this year -Naming rights for home dugout - Kiwanis Dugout! Jody says \$71,388 turned in already; their club has over \$2000 to turn in and another club has over \$1000 to turn in yet, so we are VERY close! All money must be turned in by June 30th! A special Kudos was given to the Ames Golden K for their GREAT contribution that encouraged the Division to raise it's initial \$\$ goal from \$50 K to \$75 K.

Sept (old and incoming Boards reviewed the document for possible revisions and updates, New Board discussed in October and November and approved revised plan in December. The revised plan was presented to the membership las t Thursday (after a couple postponements) with a real emphasis on recruitment and retention of members, greater participation in projects and continued publicity of our projects. Bob also brought up our need for better communication with the community on our Paper Trailer project, especially when the trailer is Full and Locked up! Several mentioned Mel in the Morning as perhaps the best news outlet for all age groups. Perhaps setting up an "on the air" session with Mel for an interview and promotion of the program, and at the same time setting up a standard public announcement system thru the radio station about OPEN or CLOSED would be a good idea. Another suggestion for the site was an "OPEN" Flag (on or near the trailer) that could be seen from the street.
